

ANY MAN CAN PUT ON A DRESS AND WALK INTO THE LADIES' RESTROOM!

Here is the proposed definition of "sexual orientation". Read it carefully. Sexual orientation means actual or perceived heterosexuality, homosexuality, bisexuality or gender expression or identity.
